2009-10 Budget Goals

- Minimize the tax impact of the budget on the residents of Burlington Township
- · Maintain existing curricular and instructional programs
- Support the academic achievement of students, especially struggling learners
- Promote the engagement of students through the use of technology

Proposed Budget Highlights

- 5 High School teachers for increased enrollment
- Reduction of 2.5 positions through needs assessment
- Improved remedial services for struggling learners
- Replacement of appx. 200 ten-year-old computers through a lease purchase program
- Required replacement of a wheelchair bus for special needs children
- Facilities improvements for A.D.A. compliance, and security cameras through capital reserve and grant program

2009-10 Proposed Budget Facts

- Total Budget \$61.6 million
- General Fund Tax Levy \$32.5 million
- Budget is more than \$1 million under the max allowable
- Building/department budgets flat at 2008-09 levels or less
- Tax impact < 3 ¢ per \$100 of assessed home value \$ 75 per year increase for avg. home assessment of
 - \$ 66 is increase in debt service
